## Your Happiness Depends on It!

When it comes to family and friends, lending a helping hand is second nature. We even find it in our hearts to reach out and help strangers in times of need because we can all, at some point, use and appreciate a helping hand (and hey, the kindness might be reciprocated in the future). But when it comes to anonymous goodwill directed to causes that, unlike people, can give nothing in return, what could motivate a donor? The answer, according to neuroscience, is that it feels good.

Researchers at the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Strokes in Bethesda, Maryland wanted to find the neural basis for unselfish acts. They found that the part of the brain that was active when a person donated happened to be the brain's reward centre—the mesolimbic pathway—responsible for doling out the dopamine-mediated euphoria associated with sex, money, food and drugs. Thus the warm glow that accompanies charitable giving has a physiological basis.

They found that donating also engaged that part of the brain that plays a role in the bonding behavior between mother and child and in romantic love. This involves oxytocin, a hormone that increases trust and cooperation.

So, giving with no expectation of reward stimulates the same part of the brain and in the same manner as enjoying a good meal or having sex...it's the safe, calorie free way to feel good!
